WHAT DOES COMMUNITY FINANCIAL CORPORATION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number
- Account balances
- Credit History

- Overdraft history
- Account transactions
- Checking account information

How?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Community Financial Corporation chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

How does Community Financial Corporation protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We also maintain other physical, electronic and procedural safeguards to protect this information and we limit access to information to those employees for whom access is appropriate.

Our affiliates include financial companies such as Banner Corporation and its banking affiliates and subsidiaries, Banner Bank, Islanders Bank, Northwest Financial Corporation, Community Financial Corporation, Banner Investment Advisors, LLC, and Springer Development, LLC. Banner Investment Services is a trade name for Banner Bank for the sale of retail non-deposit investment products. Skagit Bank is a trade name for Banner Bank in Washington.
